<sup>1</sup>Includes expenditures for residential care facilities, ambulance providers, medical care delivered in nontraditional settings (such as community centers, senior citizens centers, schools, and military field stations), and expenditures for Home- and Community-Based Waiver programs under Medicaid.

<sup>2</sup>Includes expenditures for care in freestanding facilities only. Additional services of this type that are provided in hospital-based facilities are considered hospital care.

<sup>3</sup>Includes care provided in nursing care facilities, continuing care retirement communities, state and local government nursing facilities, and nursing facilities operated by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

<sup>4</sup>Includes all administrative costs (federal, state, and local employees' salaries; contracted employees, including fiscal intermediaries; rent and building costs; computer systems and programs; other materials and supplies; and other miscellaneous expenses) associated with insuring people enrolled in the following health insurance programs: Medicare, Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Department of Defense, Department of Veterans Affairs, Indian Health Service, workers' compensation, maternal and child health, vocational rehabilitation, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, and other federal programs.

<sup>5</sup>Difference between premiums earned and benefits incurred. This is the amount of health insurance spending attributed to nonmedical benefit expenses such as administrative costs, additions to reserves, rate credits and dividends, premium taxes, and plan profits or losses. This category includes the net cost for private health insurance companies that insure enrollees in private health insurance plans, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, property and casualty insurance (health portion only), and workers' compensation (health portion only).

<sup>6</sup>Includes health care services delivered by government public health agencies.

<sup>7</sup>Excludes research and development expenditures of drug companies and other manufacturers and providers of medical equipment and supplies. These categories are included in the expenditure class in which the product falls, because such expenditures are covered by the payment received for that product.

<sup>8</sup>See Sources and Definitions, Average annual rate of change (percent change).
